

#### **NVYC Commodore's Report**

With the beginning of a new year, I am honored to serve the Napa Valley Yacht Club as your Commodore for 2019. The theme this year is OUR VOYAGE FORWARD. Our club has changed in many ways over the past several years, and we can expect more change in the coming year. We have gone from a club of large boats to smaller, with fewer cruise-outs to other bay area clubs than before. Also, there are fewer member boat owners than before. As a result of these changes, we have more clubhouse activities and fewer cruises and other boating events. The trend in boat ownership is positive, as many of our new members have boats, and we're looking forward to more cruising this year.

Our club facility has seen continual improvements over the past few years, and has never looked as good as it now does. Our deck has canvas awnings, facilitating larger parties in the warm season. Our new dock and power pedestal improvements were added-to this past year with a new T-section of dock at the south end, thanks to efforts by Evelyn Silveri and Tom Hildreth. Managing these improvements and others was Port Captain Greg Parker, who also added more paved parking and, with help from Allan Mueller, renovation of our Bocce courts. Our galley is at its best and our sound system has been upgraded, providing MP3 capabilities. These facilities are in good condition for use and enjoyment of our members and quests in club and private activities, and of cruise-ins from other clubs.

Thanks mainly to the skillful management of Port Captain Greg Parker, our club has become a popular cruising destination for other bay area clubs. As our "Goodwill Ambassador," he manages scheduling, facilitates docking and greets them as they disembark, providing maps and other information about Napa. Scheduling for cruise-ins is under way, and the dock is already reserved for the annual Bottle Rock festival.

We will continue our community support activities, such as hosting Coast Guard vessel inspections, hosting informal meetings with city, county and Corps officials on river issues, Fourth of July and Christmas boat parades, Camille Creek High School Student Day, river cleanup day and other community outreach activities.

In our voyage we must also look ahead for potentially troubled waters. With no plans by the Army Corps for funding flood control improvements along our riverfront, including our parking lot, the City and Flood Control District will be looking at flood control improvements and fund them without the Corps.

Our Long-Range Planning committee will be working with these two agencies to provide a better, more compatible project design than the one produced by the Army Corps. This same committee will begin positioning our club for future negotiations with the City on the extension of our lease.

We have all the makings of a successful year ahead. Our bar, galley and contract galley staff are all up and operating. We also have an impressive volunteer committee crew lined up for 2019, with their activities already under way. As we are a volunteer organization, all members must contribute in some way, and I ask every member to review the list of committee chairs and select one or two of them to offer your volunteer help. Let's make this year's voyage a good one for all of us.



# In Memorium – Steve Vartan, 1944-2019



Obituary from the Napa Valley Register

Steve Vartan embarked on another "Strange Trip" when he passed away suddenly on January 2, 2019 after suffering pulmonary embolisms and heart failure. Born in San Francisco to Sam and Mary Vartan, Steve was looking forward to his 75th birthday in February and hosting yet another of his gourmet dinner parties. He is survived by his wife of 48 years, Ellen, daughter Kristen (SO Sean Donaghue) and son Paul, his wife Debbie, their two adorable daughters, Aria and Aila, his sister Sue Mann and two nieces.

Steve graduated from Lincoln High School in San Francisco and the University of Oregon School of Architecture in 1968 where he was a member of Sigma Nu fraternity. He served in the Coast Guard Reserves following his

college years and proudly said that the Alameda Island Coast Guard Base was never attacked under his watch. His long career in the development and city planning business took him and his family to Iowa, Hawaii, down the SF peninsula to Burlingame and Belmont, Arizona, Florida and Palm Desert in southern California before the family retired to Napa in 1994. As president of the Napa Yacht Club Homeowners Association he obtained permits for maintenance dredging of the lagoons from seven state and federal agencies. He worked closely with local governments and the Corps of Engineers to facilitate the dredging of the Napa River in 2016. He served several terms on the City of Belmont Planning Commission.

After joining the Napa Valley Yacht Club in 1996 the family moved to the water-oriented Napa Yacht Club and purchased a 35' Mainship flybridge cruiser that became the "Strange Trip." He loved the NVYC, serving two full "watches" as a flag officer and two terms as Commodore as well as directing the remodel of the clubhouse, deck and dock and leading cruises all over the Bay and Delta. His wonderful sense of humor and competitive nature came into play during many domino games aboard the "Strange Trip". The family's late Chocolate Labrador, Marceau, was an entertaining and loyal boat dog that always protected the club and cruisers, refusing to go anywhere without his master. Steve leaves a wide ranging network of friends and colleagues who will always remember him as a fine man who treated everyone with respect and kindness. A celebration of life will be announced at a later date.


