Pacific Coast Yachting Association (PCYA), established in 1923, is composed of yachting and cruising associations from Vancouver, B.C., Canada, to San Diego, California. These associations are in turn comprised of hundreds of clubs representing thousands of competitive and recreational boaters.

QUICK FACTS ABOUT THE PACIFIC INTER-CLUB YACHT ASSOCIATION

We have had quite a few new members this last year. This is a short summary about PICYA to inform everyone about this great organization. The Pacific Inter-Club Yacht Association was formed in San Francisco, California May 12, 1896, with Charles G. Yale (San Francisco Yacht Club) as its first President. For some time prior to this, the major San Francisco Bay yacht clubs were considering an organization for inter-communication, uniform racing rules and to encourage yachting. The five charter clubs and the year they were founded were: California Y.C. (1893), Corinthian Y.C. (1886), Encinal Y.C. (1890), Pacific Y.C. (1873) and the San Francisco Y.C. (1869). None of the still existing charter clubs has maintained continuous membership in PICYA. South Bay Y.C. founded in 1888 joined PICYA in 1897.

Each Yacht Club that belongs to PICYA has delegates that attend the monthly meetings.

PICYA is an organization of 105 Yacht Clubs in the San Francisco Bay Area. They have what they call Coty points, and these points are achieved by various activities, such as community involvement, newsletters, training and participation at "Opening Day on the Bay" and monthly conferences and meetings.

It was announced at the 55th Annual PICYA Awards on November 9th, 2020 that Napa Valley Yacht Club received a **Four-Star** rating from PICYA. NVYC is 33 years old and we usually have had just a one or two star rating. Only three other clubs received a four star rating. Maxine Maas has 17 years of perfect attendance. Maxine Maas and Pat Scarcelli are our PICYA Delegates that usually attend all meetings. In 2020, meetings after mid March were zoom meetings as well as the parade for Opening Day on Bay. It was a team effort and we are very thrilled to receive this Four Star Rating. After a very difficult year this made me very happy to achieve this **Four Star Rating**. Once we receive the physical award we will proudly hang it on our wall.







Art visited more than 40 countries, often with his wife, Angela, one of our favorite bartenders.




