MEMBER STORIES: LEAPING FOR MY LIFE

I was in the Army, in my early twenties, and stationed at Fort Knox, Kentucky, not far from my home in Louisville. It was a beautiful spring weekend, but I was on duty at the base.

It happened to be the same weekend that the historic *Belle of Louisville*, the famous steam-powered paddle-wheeler, which had been completely refurbished, was about to inaugurate her maiden cruise on the Ohio river. I was particularly interested because the *Belle*, originally under a different name, had been purchased by the City of Louisville through the good offices of Marlow Cook, then a county judge and later a distinguished U.S. Senator, and I had helped in his election to the bench.


When two friends from Louisville invited me to join them in their small runabout to observe the festivities, I could not resist, and effect went AWOL.

We were in the middle of the river in our small boat when our motor conked out, just as the giant paddle-wheeler made a wide turn and headed directly toward us. Our frantic efforts to restart to motor were of no avail.

We waved frenetically to the *Belle*, and her passengers waived happily back. Meanwhile she was bearing down on us. We heard the captain of the *Belle* pull the engines into reverse, but it was too late. Just at the moment of impact, the three of us made a mighty leap and clambered. aboard the main deck which fortunately for us – was just a few feet above water level. Our boat was smashed to smithereens. We spent the rest of the afternoon with the now somewhat subdued merrymakers. We were celebrities of a sort, and our pictures were taken by the many photographers aboard.

The following Monday as I arrived at the base, I was immediately summoned to my company commander's office. As I entered, there he was holding a copy of the Louisville *Courier-Journal*, with a picture of myself and my buddies. I feared the worst, but he let me off with a mild reprimand and a chuckle. I like to think that he was relieved that I had survived, and that maybe he admired my agility.

I am happy to report that the *Louisville Belle* was unscathed, and for many years thereafter engaged in an annual race with the *Delta Queen*, held the Wednesday before the Kentucky Derby.



Napa Valley Yacht Club Announces New Kayak Storage Program



We have a new storage container at the Club for members to store their kayaks in. It is only for members, and the monthly storage charge is \$10. Robert Fowles has keys to the padlock on the container and will issue one to each member that wants to store a kayak in there. The key deposit is \$20, which will be returned when the key is returned. Members store kayaks in the container at their own risk.

Members may launch kayaks from the public boat ramp or our dock. If they want to use our dock, they need a key to the gangway, which is keyed separately and also requires a \$20 key deposit, which will also be returned when that key is returned.

This program eliminates dragging your kayak in your car to get to someplace to launch. This program works well for all the members that don't have their own docks near home, or would just like to start their kayak trip closer to downtown and the northern parts of the river, which are very peaceful.

Club Rental Information

Since rates and rules have changed, as of July 1st., this article will clarify those changes and also inform new members of their rental possibilities.

Rates have changed as follows:

Rental rates for members are now \$200, plus a cleaning fee of \$120 and a security deposit of \$150 (refundable).

Rental rates for member's affiliations (i.e., Spanish club, winetasters, etc.) are now \$400.00, plus \$120.00 cleaning fee and a security deposit of \$150.00 (refundable). The sponsoring member <u>must</u> be present for the event and is responsible for ensuring that all required procedures are followed, by signature.

A review of other facilities' rents show that our rates are still relatively reasonable. We are now allowed full indoor seating, which is 56 persons. Additional seating for another 40 or so on the deck is available.

Interested members are to contact our Rental Manager, Tom Atkinson, for available dates or any other information sought. Requested dates are confirmed upon receipt of either a deposit (1/2 of rental fee), or the full amount.






