2022 NAPA VALLEY YACHT CLUB PORT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The fall season at the NVYC dock kicked off with the Sequoia Yacht Club cruise-in on Labor Day weekend. They were followed by the Tower Park Yacht Club, Point San Pablo Yacht Club, Coyote Point Yacht Club and Solano Yacht Club. All our guests had a wonderful time and many reported being impressed by the hospitality of the members of the NVYC.

The NVYC also hosted the Ohana Wa'a Outrigger Canoe Club's Paddle for a Cure Fundraiser event on October 22 to raise money for breast cancer research and support. The



event featured a silent auction and lunch prepared by chef Almir Daphonseca and students from the Culinary Institute of America at Greystone. Over 100 paddlers from outrigger canoe clubs as far away as Monterey Bay and South Lake Tahoe participated in a rigorous paddle through the River Park and Napa Yacht Club neighborhoods, then to downtown Napa and back to the NVYC. NVYC member Tom Wong reported that their goal was to raise \$10,000 from donations and auction items and they exceeded that. Congratulations to all the Ohana Wa'a members who had a hand in this success!

The Army Core of Engineers, the City of Napa, and the Napa County Flood Control & Water Conservation District conducted dredging of the Napa River from the downtown bridge to Kennedy Park to a depth of nine feet at mean lower low water. The equipment included a clamshell dredger and scow to transfer the spoils to the drop site off Coombs Street. The spoils were then moved on dump trucks to the potential park to be constructed at the end of South Jefferson Street. Port Captains Robert Fowles, Tom Hildreth and Greg Parker worked directly with the project consultant, Jason Gold, and the contractor, Pacific Dredging & Construction, allowing them to use the NVYC dock as their base of operations, in exchange for dredging along our dock. Unfortunately, the spoils in front of the NVYC dock were wetter and contained more silt than the rest of the spoils, and the contractor the city hired to transfer the spoils from Coombs Street to South Jefferson Street refused to accept any more of it after only half the dock was dredged. So, only the western half of our dock was dredged, including the west side of the finger at the far west end of the dock. Port Captain Tom Hildreth reported on December 4 that we now have a 6'-8" depth there at a 0' low tide, which is more than double what it was prior to the dredging. The dredgers also took a big bite out of the sand bar on the east side of the island, just south of the NVYC dock.

The contractor and project consultant were disappointed that they could not dredge the entire dock for us but expressed their appreciation to the NVYC for allowing them to use our dock as their base of operations. Jason Gold said, "Please let your members know how much I and Pacific Dredging & Construction appreciated the use of your facility. The NVYC made the job much easier for us than it would have been if we had to keep our equipment at the Napa Valley Marina, which was our only other option."

2022 NAPA VALLEY YACHT CLUB BAR CAPTAIN'S REPORT



CLUB RENTAL INFORMATION

Club rentals are for the use of the Napa Valley Yacht Club members. There are two categories: rentals for member's family events, such as birthdays, graduation parties, or just family gettogethers/parties; the other is for organizations that club members belong to, such as the French Club, Spanish Club, wine club, etc. For member family events, no insurance policy is required. The organization that the club member is renting for must give the Rental Manager a copy of their organization's insurance policy. For both, a club member must be an attendee and is responsible to ensure that the Club's rental procedures are followed, as identified in the rental agreement.

If the renter is intending to use a caterer, the caterer must give the Rental Mgr. a copy of their catering license and insurance and insure that the Club is cleaned up and the kitchen is left in the clean manner in which they were found.

Rental Fees:

- 1. If the Club is being rented for a family event, the rental fee is \$200.00 plus a cleaning fee of \$120.00, totaling \$320.00, and a security deposit of \$150.00 (separate check), which is refundable.
- 2. For a member's organization, the rental fee is \$400.00, with a cleaning fee of \$120.00, totaling \$520.00, and a security deposit of \$150.00 (separate check), which is refundable.
- 3. There is a fee of \$100.00 if the kitchen is to be used to prepare a meal, for either a member or caterer. If the oven is only used for warming up foods, there is no charge unless the oven requires cleaning, then there is a charge of \$50.00. There is a \$50.00 charge for utilizing the gas bar-b-q. If club wine glasses are broken there is a \$10.00 charge for each one broken.
- 4. A deposit of 50% of the rental fee, or the whole rental fee, by check, is required along with the returned rental application in order to secure the date of your event. The remainder of the fee, if
 - any, is required at least 10 days prior to the event. Should there be a valid need to cancel, the Rental Manager has the discretion to consider a refund of fees paid, if it has not impacted other missed rental opportunities.

Renters are required to ensure that, if used, the club's dishes, glassware, silverware, pots and pans have been rinsed, scraped clean of food residues and stacked on the kitchen sink. Trash must be bagged and deposited outside in the club's trash containers.

Potential renters should call the Club Rental Mgr., Tom Atkinson, at 707-224-3392 or tcatkinson@sbcglobal.net. He will meet with the renter on the day of the event (or earlier) and show them opening and closing procedures.

There will be Haggis, Tatties & Neeps as well as something hearty for those who might be a little concerned about all the stories they have heard about Haggis!



- Vessel operators certification would have been handled by DMV instead of DBW
- Copper-based bottom paints would be banned without viable substitutes being available
