2023 is proving to be another great year for the Napa Valley Yacht Club!

This year we have run the gamut of great meals, heavy appetizers and Pot Luck dinners....all in an effort to find the "sweet spot" where we are able to maintain the quality of meals that we have all come accustomed to with a price point that is considered to be acceptable to the membership and not losing money doing so.

We have tried a number of approaches, even raising the prices.....for many, many reasons, these efforts proved fruitless, we were losing money on every meal.....when I say losing money...I mean just that. The club was subsidizing the cost of the meals (even after the increase to \$38 per meal!!)

One does not need to be Warren Buffet to see that this is a true recipe ('scuze the pun) for disaster.

After much deliberation, numerous meetings and hundreds of well-intentioned suggestions, it has been determined that the Galley will be going in a slightly different direction in an effort to corral the seemingly out of control costs.

Chef Nancy will be creating one of her masterpieces for all of us to enjoy one weekend a month.

The other three weeks will be catered meals, BBQ your own meat (we will supply salad, sides and desserts) or a Pot Luck meal (you would be surprised at how popular and successful these events are!)

We are arranging 3 course meals ranging from BBQ to Italian to American comfort and many many more.

If you have a caterer or restaurant that you enjoy and think the rest of the members may enjoy.....let me know who they are and Ill gladly approach them and see if we can get them in the rotation.

There will be a couple of other small changes that will accompany this swing to a different operation.

- The food will be delivered to the clubhouse.
- The food will be served to the membership.
- One person from each table will be asked to clear the dishes and put them in the galley for cleaning.
- Depending on the food suppliers policy, meal commitment deadline MAY change.

These are definitely untested procedures but with a small amount of patience and understanding during the learning process, We, the Flag officers, believe this may be the ticket to “having our cake and eating it too” (c’mon....you know I had to do that!!!)

As always, constructive criticism is always welcomed, we think we have this figured out but there are so many moving parts to this situation, there are bound to be areas that will need to be fine-tuned as we go along. If you think you have a good suggestion or a better mousetrap, speak up! I am always open to hearing other folk’s ideas. We are confident we are on the right track here and we ask that you be a little flexible as we navigate through this rough patch.....we truly believe it will be worth the effort.

Port Captains' Report



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
